# Year 4 Small Grant Mechanism Program Announcement ACCELERATOR AWARDS

#### Introduction:

The NIH-funded Emory/Georgia Tuberculosis Research Advancement Center (TRAC; P30Al168386) Accelerator Award small grant program aims to **efficiently** provide small amounts of funding to fill key funding gaps for targeted needs and overcome barriers for critical research.

#### Deadlines - NEW!

- The deadline for applications for TRAC year 4 is October 17, 2025.
  - o Awarded funds must be expended by February 28, 2026.
- Another call for applications will be released in early 2026 for awards in TRAC year 5 which begins March 1, 2026.

#### Funds are intended to be used to:

- Support key research that will enable a new NIH application (F, K, or R series) or other externally funded grant expected to be submitted within the next 12 months.
- Gather data needed for a scored NIH application that is currently being revised for
- resubmission.

# The following categories of Awards are available:

- OPPORTUNITY AWARDS: Will provide up to \$4,000 to conduct targeted and timesensitive TB research activities. Funds should remove obstacles to carrying out research. Expected outcomes include a manuscript for publication and submission of a NIH or other externally funded grant proposal within 12 months. Funds may be used for salary/wages of consultants, study participant incentives, Emory/Georgia TRAC core service costs, and laboratory assays. Other uses will be considered. All requests must be well justified. No indirect costs are allowed.
- **XPERT REVIEW**: Provide up to \$1,000 to solicit outside reviews for a NIH R01 proposal.

# **Eligibility:**

Faculty, Post Docs (PhDs, PharmD, DVMs, and MDs including those in residency or fellowship) and PhD students at a U.S. Emory/Georgia TRAC institution. While all Faculty are eligible, junior investigators without independent funding are given preference. PhD students and Post Docs must provide a Letter of Support from their Primary Research Mentor.

# **Application Instructions:**

Applications must be submitted online no later than **5pm EST on Friday October 17, 2025**, via the <u>online portal</u>.

The application portal requests the following components:

- Project title
- Project description (maximum 500 words)

- Biosketch(es)
- Brief NIH-style budget and budget justification <u>describing how funds will be expended</u> by February 28, 2026
- Letter of support, where applicable
- Description of expected outcomes
- IRB/IACUC approval or status, where applicable

#### **Awardee Expectations:**

- Awarded funds expended by February 28, 2026.
- IRB or IACUC approval <u>must be obtained</u> before any funds are released.
- Awardees will be required to submit a 12-month progress report using a template provided by the TRAC.
- Awardees will be required to cite the Emory/Georgia TRAC grant number (P30Al168386) in all publications and presentations that use data collected under the support of the grant.
- Awardees will be expected to share the data they collect with the TRAC Dataverse in accordance with the TRAC Clinical and Population Sciences Core data sharing agreement.
- Awardees will be required to submit their updated NIH biosketch and fill out an annual career survey to track their advancement in the field, as well as <u>serve on the TRAC Developmental</u> <u>Core mock study section committee during their time of award.</u>
